GNOT 2021: If you haven't played in a team event, consider participating in the GNOT heat at **Fremantle Bridge Club on Sunday 11**th **April 2021**. Playing in a team event is a different experience and a lot of fun.

GNOT is a Grand National Open Teams' event, conducted by the Australian Bridge Federation, with heats held in all States. Each State organisation is then responsible for qualifying a number of teams to the National Finals in November. The heats of the GNOT are held by most clubs in Australia and are the only gold point event which a majority of clubs can hold.

The Fremantle Club event will be a two session event to be held on the <u>11th of April at 9 45 a.m. for a 10.00 a.m. start</u>. The cost of entry is \$100.00 per team. This sum includes a payment of \$15.00 per team to BAWA plus fees to the ABF for Gold Points. Director will be lan Rawlings – and the FBC convenor is Jenny Langridge. At the conclusion of the event there will be a light nibble either cheese and biscuit selection or pizza and a wine or soft drink. Nominations can be made either via the web or entered into the Events Book at the club rooms.

The winning team together with a number of placegetters (depending on the number of teams who enter) have the option of competing in the W.A. final on 29 and 30 July 2017 @ Nedlands Bridge Club. There is no obligation for any team to participate. Gold points are awarded to each team for each win. Teams may be of 4, 5 or 6 people. Only 4 can play each match. This is the only teams' event conducted by the club during the year. The team must contain a minimum of at least one financial Fremantle Bridge Club member. The events book is open for entries.
